



# Living Lace™ Nicholas Diamond Hybrid Footed Fern

### Phlebosia 'Nicholas Diamond'

Hardiness Zone: (annual)

Other Names: Pyrrosia x Phlebodium Group/Class: Leafjoy Houseplants

### **Description:**

A creeping fern variety featuring broad, undulating sea-green fronds with deeply cut lobes and downward arching crests; it increases in size slowly, via creeping fuzzy rhizomes; perfect for hanging baskets or containers in low to medium light

#### **Features & Attributes**

Living Lace Nicholas Diamond Hybrid Footed Fern's attractive crinkled lobed leaves emerge chartreuse, turning bluish-green in color throughout the year on a plant with an arching habit of growth.

This is a dense herbaceous evergreen houseplant with a shapely form and gracefully arching foliage. Its relatively fine texture sets it apart from other indoor plants with less refined foliage. This plant should not require much pruning, except when necessary to keep it looking its best.

## **Planting & Growing**

When grown indoors, Living Lace Nicholas Diamond Hybrid Footed Fern can be expected to grow to be about 20 inches tall at maturity, with a spread of 20 inches. It grows at a medium rate, and under ideal conditions can be expected to live for approximately 20 years. This houseplant performs well in both bright or indirect sunlight and strong artificial light, and can therefore be situated in almost any well-lit room or location. It does best in average to evenly moist soil, but will not tolerate standing water. The surface of the soil shouldn't be allowed to dry out completely, and so you should expect to water this plant once and possibly even twice each week. Be aware that your particular watering schedule may vary depending on its location in the room, the pot size, plant size and other conditions; if in doubt, ask one of our experts in the store for advice. It will benefit from a regular feeding with a general-purpose fertilizer with every second or third watering. It is not particular as to soil pH, but grows best in rich soil. Contact the store for specific recommendations on pre-mixed potting soil for this plant.



There are many factors that will affect the ultimate height, spread and overall performance of a plant when grown indoors; among them, the size of the pot it's growing in, the amount of light it receives, watering frequency, the pruning regimen and repotting schedule. Use the information described here as a guideline only; individual performance can and will vary.
